

# SR MARY ROSE INDOOR POOL AND FITNESS CENTRE CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

BY ENTERING THE CENTRE EACH PATRON AGREES TO THE CONDITIONS OF ENTRY AND ALL HEALTH AND SAFETY REQUIREMENTS. FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THESE CONDITIONS OF ENTRY MAY RESULT IN THE INDIVIDUAL OR GROUP BEING REFUSED ENTRY TO THE CENTRE OR BEING ASKED TO LEAVE IMMEDIATELY.

## 1. General Purpose of these Terms and Conditions Policy

The overriding purpose of these terms and conditions is to provide a safe and non-threatening environment for all patrons, employees and other users of the Centre

## 2. Centre Management

For safety and security reasons, all patrons accessing the Centre must:

- a. Obey all signs around the Centre; and
- b. Follow all reasonable requests and instructions given by the College and employees of.

## 3. General terms of Entry

An entry fee to the Centre must be paid in accordance with the fee schedule. Anyone attempting to gain entry without paying or without authorisation may be refused entry to the Centre. Bags and other items may be subject to inspection and patrons may be searched. Persons who refuse inspections or searches may be refused entry to the Centre. The consumption of alcohol, smoking, and drug use is not permitted in the Centre. Alcoholic beverages, drugs, weapons or any other substances or objects which are prohibited by law are not permitted to be brought into the Centre. Glass and other breakables are not permitted to be brought into the Centre. Animals are not permitted to be brought into the Centre (other than Guide Dogs).

## 4. Child Supervision

The College supports the WATCH AROUND WATER program and follows their guidelines.

- a. Children under 10 are not allowed entry unless under active supervision by a person 16 years or older.
- b. Parents or guardians should actively supervise their children at all times. As such, they should be ready for action, including unexpected entry to a pool.
- c. A parent or guardian must accompany their children between 0-5 years in the water at all times, and must remain within arm's reach of the child.
- d. For children 6-10 years a parent should be close enough to make eye contact with the child and be constantly watching them.

## 5. General Behaviour

All patrons must behave in a manner that is safe and respectful for the enjoyment and safety of other patrons using the Centre. Any behaviour which is considered offensive, inappropriate or interferes with the enjoyment of other patrons within the Centre will be acted upon and may result in the patron being evicted and/or banned from the Centre.

Specifically:

- a) Foul, abusive or inappropriate language or behaviour is not permitted.
- b) Running, pushing, backflips and other potentially dangerous behaviour is not permitted.
- c) Diving is only permitted where the depth of the pool indicates greater than 1.2m. (Please seek clarification from Centre staff)
- d) No rowdy activities in the changerooms
- e) Children over the age of 5 years are required to use gender appropriate changerooms.

To respect the privacy of all visitors, any video, camera or recording equipment is not to be used in the Centre without prior approval of Centre staff. Use of mobile phones, video, camera or recording equipment is not allowed in the changerooms for any reason. For safety and security reasons, patrons are not permitted to block any entrances or exits to the Centre in any way.

## 6. Clothing, Attire and Related Matters

All patrons are requested to shower before using the facilities of the Centre. Appropriate bathing attire, apparel and footwear is to be worn at all times.

## 7. Medical Conditions and Related Matters

People with serious medical conditions, including, but not limited to, epilepsy and heart conditions, must report their condition to the Centre Duty Manager. In the interests of public health and safety, incontinent people must take necessary precautions. Patrons are not permitted to use the facilities of the Centre if they are affected by drugs, alcohol or medications which may make it unsafe for them to use the facilities. Patrons must consent to receiving any medical treatment that the Centre's staff may reasonably consider necessary or desirable in the event that they suffer an injury whilst at the Centre.

## 8. Commercial and/or business activity

No person entering the Centre shall carry out any form of commercial and/ or business activity and/ or enterprise within the Centre has first been obtained from the College. If the College provides its consent to any form of commercial and/ or business activity or enterprise, the person carrying out or responsible for the commercial and/ or business activity or enterprise shall ensure that they comply with the terms of the consent issued by the College. For the avoidance of doubt, coaching or training must not be conducted for fee or reward without the prior permission of the College.

## 9. Lost or Stolen Items

The Centre and the College does not accept liability for any theft, loss or damage to personal property, whether in the Centre or elsewhere.

## 10. Risk and Injury

Patrons enter the Centre and use its facilities at their own risk. To the full extent permitted by law, the Centre and the College does not accept liability for any injury or death to any person whilst in the Centre.

## 11. Indemnity

To the full extent permitted by law, patrons release the Centre and the College from all claims and liability to any other person and expense the Centre incurs or may incur in respect of any personal injury, death, theft, loss or damage arising from the patron's entry into and use of the Centre and its facilities or the entry or use by minors in their care or control.

## 12. Right of refusal of entry and eviction

The College reserves the right to refuse entry and evict any person at any time from the Centre as its sole discretion. The right of the College to refuse entry to any person or to evict patrons from the Centre includes, but is not limited to, all matters concerning:

- a. Persons under the influence of drugs or alcohol;
- b. Dangerous or unsafe behaviour;
- c. Disorderly, disruptive, inappropriate or antisocial behaviour;
- d. Vandalism; and
- e. Admission evasion

Specifically, the College may refuse entry to, or evict a person from, the Centre who in the opinion of the College may compromise the safety or overall enjoyment of other patrons of the Centre or its facilities. A person or group refused entry to, or evicted from the Centre, has no right to a refund will be refused. The College reserves the right to ban a person or group of persons from the Centre for as long as a period of time as it may deem necessary. For the avoidance of doubt, the College may decide at its sole discretion to permanently ban a person from the Centre.
